Friendly reminder: using a Sharpie to write your child's name or initials on items helps us keep track!





The Evergreen group enjoyed gymnastics, rock climbing and swimming.




The group that stayed at BVS made trips to Franconia Inn for snowshoeing, tubing and a sleigh ride, and a trip to Victory Lanes for bowling.
